"GRADING" - Stamps and coins have a grading system which is reliable if you know your dealer quite well. The use of the term "Mint" in reference to glass can be misleading because manufacturing flaws do not eliminate a piece as being in mint condition. Wouldn't it be better to use "Excellent" for the best grade of Heisey? Then we could eliminate bubbles, ripples, handle problems, as well as chips, cracks etc. We use our own personal grading system which works for us:

- . Don't expect the old patterns to be perfect, especially Pillows, Fandango, etc.
- . If it has a defect, does it prevent me from displaying the item in my collection
- . Can the defect that exists be repaired without changing the original appearance of the item?
- . How common is the item? If rare, we buy it and hope to replace it with a better grade item later.
- . If a dealer "talks up" an item, check it again and again. Be suspicious.
